

# Ash Wednesday



The word "lent" has its origin in the same root as one of the German words for "spring," Lenz. As nature awakens from the death of winter, so the Christian finds newness of life in Christ, rising from sin's death.

During the 40 days of Lent, God's baptized people cleanse their hearts through the discipline of Lent: repentance, prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lent is a time in which God's people prepare with joy for the paschal feast (Easter). It is a time in which God renews His people's zeal in faith and life. It is a time in which we pray that we may be given the fullness of grace that belongs to the children of God.

#### **RESPONSORY**

- P: On the night before He died, Jesus celebrated the Passover with His disciples;
- C: Jesus is our Passover Lamb.
- P: The Passover Table was set with special food, such as roasted lamb, bitter herbs, wine, and unleavened bread:
- C: Tonight, we receive the very body and blood of our Lord, in, with, and under the bread and wine.
- P: On Passover night, the Old Testament people were to remember how God delivered them from Egypt:
- **G**: Tonight, we remember how God has delivered us from sin, death, and the power of the devil.

- P: In the Upper Room, the Passover was celebrated for the final time:
- **©**: Jesus instituted a new Supper that would be celebrated for all time.
- P: The blood of the Lamb was originally painted on the doorposts of their homes in Egypt:
- **G**: The blood of Jesus was painted upon Calvary's cross and cleanses us from all sin.
- P: The blood of the Passover Lamb caused the angel of death to pass over them:
- : The blood of Jesus was shed so the angel of death would pass over us.
- P: The Passover was a picture of how God would redeem His people:
- **G**: The body and blood we receive in the Sacrament tonight bring us God's forgiveness and pardon.
